The Role of the President and Chief Executive Officer

Position summary

The President/CEO will demonstrate exceptional leadership skills and is responsible for the overall administration and direction of programs and services provided by the company. Working closely with Senior Management, the President/CEO ensures that all aspects of the company's activities are in the best interests of its members, employees, and the healthcare community in general and that the company attains its operating and financial goals in accordance with its philosophy, goals, and Strategic Plans. Appoint members and chairs and be responsible for the operation of all non-Board committees. Ensure committee activities support and align with corporate objectives.
